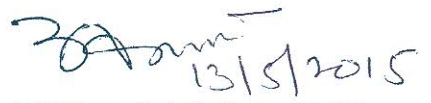

Public Notice No: EOI / NG / 13/ 2015

The Petroleum and Natural Gas Regulatory Board has received an Expression of Interest (EOI) in terms of Regulation 4(1) of the Petroleum and Natural Gas Regulatory Board (Authorizing Entities to Lay, Build, Operate or Expand Natural Gas Pipelines) Regulations, 2008 from M/s H-Energy Private Limited (HEPL) to lay, build, operate or expand natural gas pipeline from Jaigarh (District-Ratnagiri, Maharashtra) to Mangalore (District-Dakshin Kannada, Karnataka).

The details of the aforesaid proposed project as submitted by the entity in the format as per schedule "A" of the aforesaid Regulations and the map depicting the route proposed by the entity for laying, building, operating or expanding natural gas pipeline are available at the website of the PNGRB: www.pngrb.gov.in under the scrolling window 'what's new'.

In terms of Regulation 5(1) of the aforesaid regulations, the Board announces commencement of the public consultation process and solicits views in writing from any person or entity on the said EOIs, within 30 days of publication of this public notice in the newspaper. The views may be submitted in the prescribed format to the Secretary, PNGRB either through e-mail at secretary@pngrb.gov.in or through post at the address mentioned above.

Sub: Submission of Expression of Interest (EOI) for laying, building and operating Jaigarh-Mangalore Natural Gas Pipeline

Dear Sir,

H-Energy Private Limited (H-Energy) has ventured into the business of creating energy Infrastructure projects in India. H-Energy Gateway Private Limited (HEGPL), an affiliate of H-Energy, is setting up an onshore LNG regasification terminal at Jaigarh, Ratnagiri district in Maharashtra. The nameplate capacity of the LNG terminal is 8.0 MMTPA and the LNG terminal will be capable of supplying 29.0 mmscmd of regasified LNG in the downstream markets. The Jaigarh LNG Terminal is scheduled to commence operations from year 2019.

The Jaigarh LNG terminal will operate on tolling basis which will foster an environment of open access and will also ensure availability of natural gas to end users such as power plants, fertilizer units, refineries, City Gas Distribution entities and other industries. The end users and gas marketing companies will book tolling capacity to regasify LNG sourced from international markets.

The LNG terminal will be connected to two major trunk pipelines - Dahej-Uran-Dabhol-Panvel pipeline and Dabhol-Bangalore pipeline. These pipelines will be used to transport natural gas from Jaigarh LNG terminal to the downstream markets connected to the gas grid. However, these pipelines do not cater to the natural gas requirement in and around the south-western coastal stretch of Panjim, Karwar, Murudeshwar, Udupi and Mangalore which are presently not connected to the gas grid. The estimated demand for natural gas in this region is approximately

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7.0 mmscmd. In order to meet the natural gas requirement of south-west markets, H-Energy plans to lay a natural gas pipeline from Jaigarh to Mangalore. The length of the proposed Jaigarh – Mangalore pipeline is 635 kms.

Accordingly, we hereby submit an Expression of Interest (EOI) to lay, build and operate Jaigarh - Mangalore Natural Gas Pipeline along with the following documents as part of annexures:

The project is expected to commence operations from 2019. The natural gas supply from LNG terminal will feed the demand centers along the Jaigarh-Mangalore Natural Gas Pipeline.
D	Potential demand of natural gas enroute the national gas pipeline	Total demand for natural gas along the proposed pipeline is expected to be 7.0 mmscmd by 2019. The detailed information on natural gas demand is provided in Annexure-III.
E	Assessment of total gas volume for transportation in the proposed natural gas pipeline	Based on the natural gas demand, the total natural gas transportation volume/capacity for the proposed pipeline will be 7.0 mmscmd. This capacity is inclusive of common carrier capacity as required under the regulations.

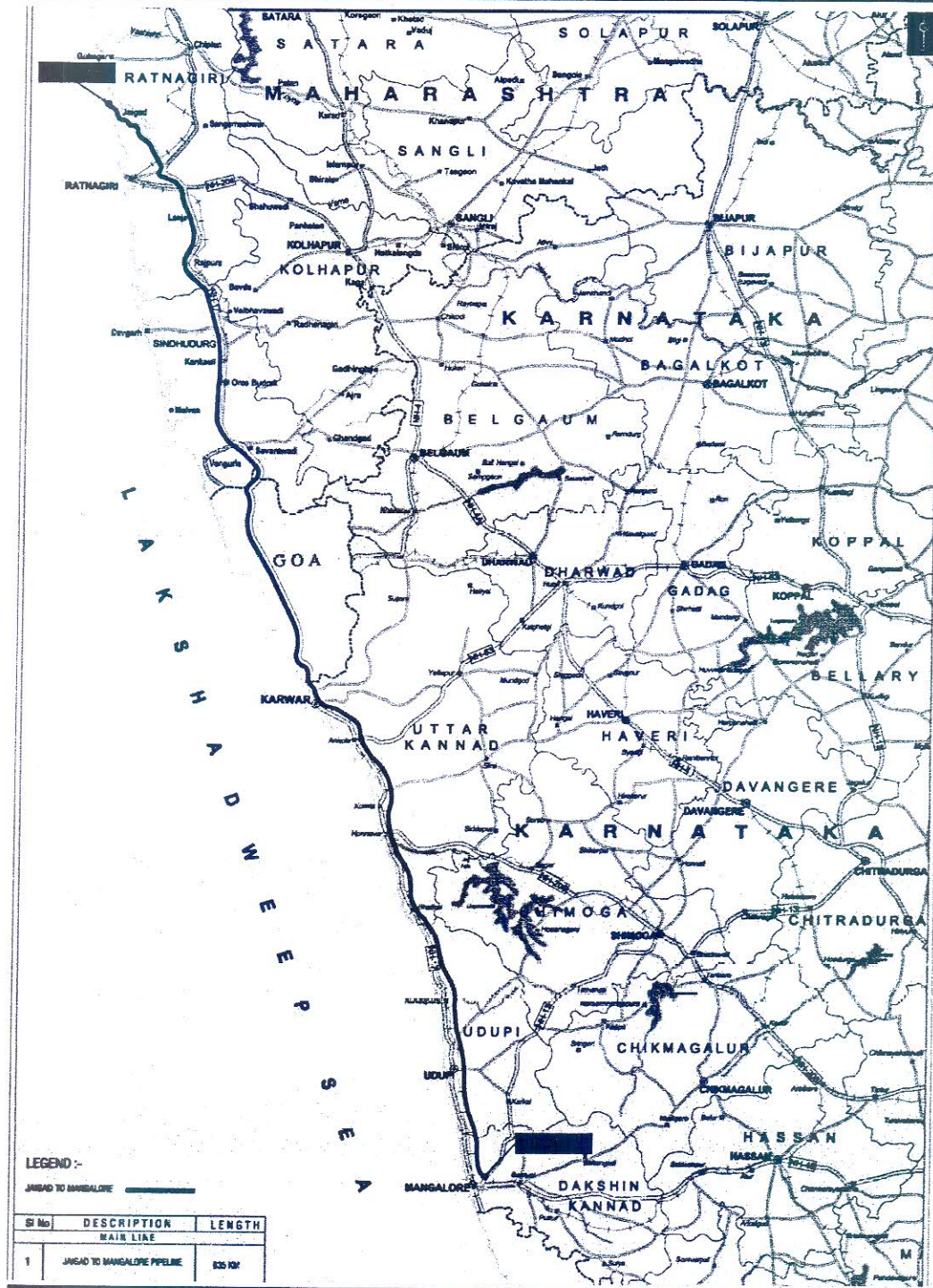
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Annexure – II : Indicative Route Map of Jaigarh – Mangalore Pipeline

Brief Plan for Utilization of Capacity in the Proposed Pipeline

Current Gas Availability Scenario

India is the fourth largest natural gas importer in the world. The natural gas demand is set to grow at a CAGR of 6.8% from 242.6 mmcsmd in 2012-13 to 746 mmcsmd in 2029-30. There is potential latent demand in the South-West regions primarily from fertilizer sector, refineries, and medium & small scale industries in the regions of Panjim, Karwar, Udupi and Mangalore.

Presently, these markets are not connected to the gas grid. The estimated potential of natural gas in these regions is estimated to be 7.0 mmsmd.

Jaigarh LNG Terminal

H-Energy Gateway Private Limited (HEGPL), an affiliate of H-Energy, is developing an onshore LNG regasification terminal at Jaigarh, Ratnagiri district, Maharashtra. The LNG terminal will be capable of daily send out capacity of 29.0 mmcsmd of natural gas. The end users and gas marketing companies will book degasification capacity in LNG terminal to unload and regasify the LNG sourced from international markets. HEGPL has achieved following milestones:

- (a) Award of EPC contract to JV of Sener and Afcons
- (b) Agreement with JSW Jaigarh Port
- (c) Environmental Clearance from Ministry of Environment & Forests (MoEF)

The construction of LNG terminal is scheduled to commence from Q4-2015 with commissioning planned in 2019. The regasified LNG from the LNG terminal will act as a source of natural gas and will feed the proposed natural gas pipeline.

H-Energy Proposal for Utilization of Proposed Pipeline

Mangalore has a unique position vis-à-vis the future demand and supply matrix of LNG. From the demand side, Mangalore is a fast-growing industrial hub with the presence of Mangalore Refinery & Petrochemicals Limited (MRPL), petrochemical complex ONGC Mangalore Petrochemicals Limited (OMPL) and Special Economic Zone Mangalore SEZ (MSEZ). Additionally, Mangalore hosts an Iron ore Industry, Fertilizer Industry and their ancillary industrial units.

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Currently, these industries are using heavy liquid sources like Fuel Oil and Naphtha for their energy and feedstock needs. Considering the growing demand of energy coupled with increasing focus on environment, there is a strong case for environment-friendly natural gas replacing these polluting fuels. H-Energy plans to utilize the proposed pipeline infrastructure to transport natural gas from Jaigarh LNG terminal to Mangalore. In addition, H-Energy also plans to connect other markets such as Panjim, Karwar and Udupi which are located along the route of the proposed pipeline.

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
